Regular Board Meeting

MEETING BUSINESS

- ✓ Steve Britton made a motion to approve the agenda. Heather Echavarria seconded the motion; it passed unanimously.
- ✓ Steven Britton made a motion to approve the minutes from the August 13, 2018 board meeting. Heather Echavarria seconded the motion; it passed unanimously.

SCHOOL REPORTS -.

- ✓ WLS Lonnie Usrey stated there are a lot of new students especially elementary age. Open House will be next Wednesday, September 19, 2018.
- ✓ CHS Student Rep Dan introduced Emma Strain. Emma discussed their welcome back luncheon and team building activities. She stated Homecoming Week begins September 24, 2018, with a parade on the 27th and a dance on the 29th. She also shared that the leadership class was asked to lead a breakout session at the Seaside event. As many as 1700 students typically attend, so this is quite an honor.
- ✓ Coq JR High Armando stated they are excited to have Taylor Ostle and Paige Yi teaching at the Junior High. He indicated that nearly half of the parents showed up for Junior High Orientation and that there are approximately 60 Junior High students participating in sports.
- ✓ Coq SR High Jeff Philley discussed the support services of counseling and mental health. Kids are connecting well with them. Jeff mentioned Tyler SIS and real time info is now available for parents. The use of this technology will improve parent/teacher conversation. Traci Gederos asked about the Vietnam Wall tour at Sturdivant Park. Jeff stated that the band will play at the opening ceremony on

- September 13, 2018. On Friday, September 14 all high school students will go to Sturdivant Park to view the wall. Geoff indicated only 5th and 6th grade will attend. Traci addressed the importance of respect and proper conduct.
- ✓ CVE Geoff stated that their Open House went really well. Geoff went as the Eagle. He felt there was a good turnout (~ 60%), but there were conflicting activities. Geoff stated that even with 1st grade now over at Lincoln, CVE is still around 400 students.
- ✓ AD Dan stated there have been consistent numbers compared to last year even with the elimination of pay-to-play fees. He mentioned Friday's football game is a home game and that Saturday is the Hall of Fame dinner. Dan also mentioned that CHS is one of 20 schools with no ejections, so coaches are doing a good job.
- ✓ **Special Programs** Wayne spent time at Open House and parents thanked him for splitting ALS classroom. He stated that the TAG conversion tables came out and that the Title I budget should be done next week. Wayne also mentioned that the beginning of year compliance requirements were being completed guickly.
- ✓ **Lincoln** Sharon stated there is a lot of energy in the building. The soft start to the school year was very useful for pre-K and K, and that 1st graders came in right on task. Amy stated that the Lincoln Open House is on September 18, 2018 from 5:00 p.m. to 6:30 p.m. Grandparents Celebration begins September 24th. Amy thanked the Board for the health curriculum. She stated that she is working with Teri to streamlining things with daycare.

DEPARTMENT REPORTS

- ✓ Maintenance Marci Gallagher stated that the increased student enrollment has made it possible to add an additional 8-hour custodian.
- ✓ Food Service Marci Gallagher stated there is now a new walk-in freezer and cooler at Lincoln which have made delivery a lot easier. A new dishwasher has been installed at CVE and the CHS kitchen will be getting metal roll up doors. Misty asked how things are going with Powers FS and Marci stated that they feed an average of 93 students a day.
- ✓ Technology Walt Wilcott stated the first week of school was busier for him and Greg than he has ever experienced. The launch of Tyler SIS required a lot of set up and he stated the secretaries and especially Cheryl Waddington deserve a lot of credit for their work on Tyler SIS.
- ✓ Transportation Keryn Ogle discussed the VW settlement. It allows for the purchase of a new bus or the retrofit of an existing bus. The Coquille School District has chosen to get a new bus which should arrive in a few weeks. This will require the elimination of one of the large buses.

BOARD REPORTS

- ✓ Legislative Forum for District Board Members and Administrators Tuesday, October 9, 2018 @ South Coast ESD Conference Room. Dinner will be provided. Steve, Misty, Cliff, Matt and Roy and Tim stated they would attend.

FISCAL REPORTS

Teri Pointer stated that with the increased enrollment resulted in additional staff and things being extremely busy. She stated that Lori has been instrumental in helping new staff find housing in the area.

SUPERINTENDENTS REPORT

Tim Sweeney gave a verbal population report of 149 students at Lincoln, 388 at CVE, 355 at CJHS, and between 305 and 310 at WLS. There are over 70 3- & 4-year olds. He provided updates on the purchase of the house on Central. Cliff wanted to make sure it is inspected prior to staff going in. Tim has been working with Dan Hampton and Stephanie Martell regarding a retaining wall for the track. He has also been working with Tim Gederos to get the red carpet room floor leveled and a door added at Lincoln. The WLS/CTE Center floor plan will include a generator in case of power outages and the baseball field will be getting some updates as well. Heather asked about number of new hires compared to last year. There are 24 new staff members overall.
