

4th Grade Weekly Work

Daily Assignments and Homework: Listed are the daily assignments that your 4th grader should complete in reading, writing, and math. Daily assignments that are not completed in class must be taken home as homework the day that they are assigned and returned to school the following school day. Please check in with your student daily to keep them on track with their weekly work.

Reading: (Daily work time: 25-50 minutes)

The first day of each week the students receive a new weekly reading packet and the previous reading packet is collected. This packet will be completed in class each week.

Assigned daily work that must be completed in class during reading small group.

Writing: (Daily work time: 45-60 minutes)

Writing lessons are assigned on the first day of each week and are due on the last day of the week. Students must complete their writing in class or as homework in order to be prepared for the follow day. The students should follow this weekly schedule to stay on track:

- Monday: Lesson Introduction and Partner Write**
 - Lesson is introduced and students practice the new writing concepts with a partner
- Tuesday: Prewrite**
 - The prewriting guidelines on page 74 of their writing handbook are used to complete this activity
- Wednesday: Rough Draft**
- Thursday: Edit/Revise**
 - Rough draft is edited by 4-5 students
- Friday: Final Draft/Writing Conference**
 - Write the final draft using the editing marks made on Thursday
 - Meet with the teacher for a writing conference to discuss final draft
 - One on one time to discuss writing format and provide instant feedback on areas of improvement

Math: (Daily work time: 30 minutes)

A new math lesson is assigned every day. Daily math is homework if it is not completed in class. When daily math work is completed they become a "Math Expert" for the day! At the end of each math unit, students that completed all assignments will receive one wing for each assignment.

Homework: Homework packets are sent home on the last day of each week. The previous homework packet needs to be signed by an adult and turned in to be scored the same day. The focus of the weekly homework packet is math fact practice, spelling, and daily reading.
