Dear Families: A Letter From Mrs. Sweeney, Principal


The first official day of school was Tuesdsay, September 7th.

As most of you know, Winter Lakes students each have a different plan for how they and their family choose to attend school. Here are some helpful hints:

- If you have not received your Google information or Odysseyware information yet, contact your Learning Specialist or the school office.
- If you are a new student at WLHS, an 8th grader, or a Freshman, your OW classes are set to what is required. As you continue through the enrollment process, you'll meet with your learning specialist, and Mrs. Regan, the academic counselor, who will chat with you about the best way for you to learn to earn your graduation requirements. Then additional classes can be added.
- For all students, your learning specialist should have contacted you by now. Please contact your school (WLE or WLHS) if they have not.
- If you are planning on attending in-person sessions at WLE, hours are 8:00 AM to 2:45 PM and you do not need to pre-schedule your student's time slot. If you are planning on attending in-person at WLHS, you MUST reserve a spot for your student in a morning or afternoon cohort. You may only attend morning or afternoon throughout the week, but not both. Please contact the main office to see what is available if you have not already done so.
- SENIORS: If you have not already met with Mrs. Sweeney and Mrs. Regan yet to discuss yoru senior plan, please get that scheduled! I want to make sure we've mapped out your path to graduation!
- I send mass emails once or twice per week with announcements and information. Feel free to ask me any questions.

the Attendance Office

As the pandemic continues to challenge us in unique, and often frustrating ways, we are anxious for normalcy, in this case, where our learning is involved. Despite these challenges and frustrations, regular attendance in school remains as critically important as ever. How that "attendance" actually happens may just look a little different right now from student to student based on their and their family's needs. There are many ways to achieve a positive attendance profile:

- > Participate in a video class
- Communicate with a teacher via chat, text, message, communication app, or email
- A phone call between the teacher and student
- Posting completed cousework to a learning management system (Odysseyware) or web-based platform or via email
- > Turning in completed course work, including paper packets, on a given day
- > Attending class on campus
- > Visiting with a Winter Lakes teacher in the Google "Office Hours" platform

It is the responsibility of Winter Lakes students to earn an "attendance hit" daily, Monday through Thursday, via one or more of the above means.

Please note, merely logging in to your student Odysseyware account $\underline{\textbf{DOES NOT}}$ count toward positive attendance.

Beyond an individualized education, Winter Lakes Schools and the Coquille School District offer many services to our students in need. According to a 2017-18 report 21,756 students in the state of Oregon were classified as "Homeless", some of them in Coquille. These students often struggle harder to succeed and graduate. This is why we are stepping up to provide vital services to help fill some of the gaps created by homelessness.

Completion of a Student Residency Questionnaire helps us target those families who qualify as "Homeless", and provide them with critical services. You should have completed one of these forms at registration. Make sure to complete a new one any time that your living situation has changed. If you have any questions about your current status, contact our Director of Special Programs at the discrict office at (541) 396-2181.

We have an enormous number of resources available. Your requests for assistance of any kind will be met with kindness and discretion. We have:
